Loreto tops tables again

ONCE again Loreto Normanhurst has secured its position as the top Catholic school in NSW following its HSC results.

There were 13 Loreto Normanhurst students in the All Rounders list, who gained Band 6 marks in 10 or more units of study. There were five Top Achievers in Course, with students placing in the top 10 or top 20 in the state for their subject.

Principal Barbara Wat-

kins said the results ranked them as 26 across the state.

"We congratulate the Class of 2015 on their outstanding academic results, and for being successes in so many other ways," Ms Watkins said. "They are a wonderful group of young women who are joy-filled and full of values."

There were also 105 students with a total of 289 mentions in the Distinguished Achievers List,

meaning they gained a Band 6 result in a subject.

An estimated 22 per cent of students attained an ATAR above 95; 43 per cent were above 90 and 77 per cent were above 80.

"We aim to assist our students understand that they can, with an excellent and holistic education, make a difference – for themselves, for their society, and for those without a voice," Ms Watkins said.
